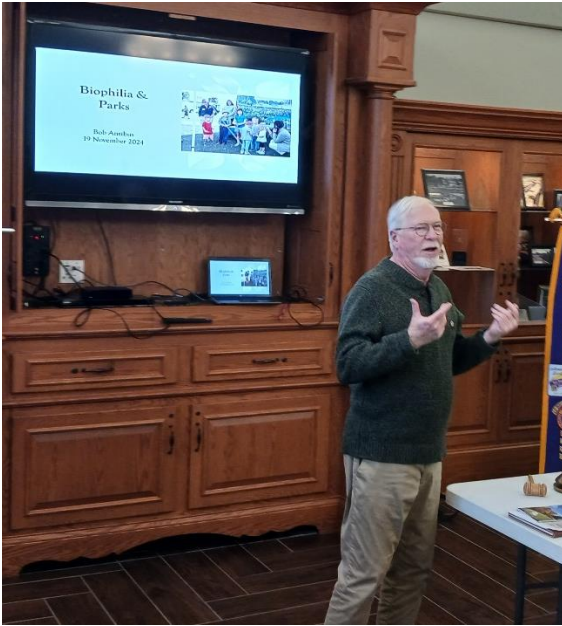
November 19th meeting:

Long Time Bluffton, OH resident Dr. Bob Antibus spoke at the Bluffton Lion's club meeting on Tuesday November 19th at the Town Hall at noon. Dr. Antibus, Emeritus Professor of Biology at Bluffton University has served and continues to serve as Johnny Appleseed Metropolitan District Board Commissioner for 32 years. When we look on the Allen County map, one can see 20 locations in the park district where much is offered to the public. Dr. Antibus discussed the Motter Metro Park in Bluffton. This area was planted in prairie grasses to restore more native grassland habitat. The Little Riley Creek runs through the property which provides habitat for wetland and water species of plants and animals. A gazebo was recently added and a wildlife observation deck and wetland mitigation project will be added.
